RENEWED HOPE FOR CHILDREN AND TEENS – REHOCT COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATION’S BRIEF PRESENTATION

I. MOTIVATION OF THE CREATION OF THE ORGANIZATION:

Recognizing the immense suffering of children and teens (**5 to 18 years old**) that have lost parents and guardians and those facing poverty and critical vulnerability;

Understanding that every child is a special gift from the Almighty God with his/her God-given potential to fulfill regardless of the social, cultural, economic, or religious backgrounds;

Witnessing how daily grieving and vulnerable children and teens live and face harsh realities of life and poverty which lead to illiteracy, school dropout, desperation to achieve their dreams, and a lack of support to help them heal and rebuild their hopes and aspirations for a better future;

Believing that, every child has inherent worth and a God-given potential waiting to be fulfilled and; that we live in a world that often overlooks their pain, we are called to be a beacon of hope, reflecting the compassionate love of Christ to those who need it most;

Therefore, with a profound commitment to serving our community and motivated by the call to love, mercy and compassion to one another, we have decided unanimously this Tuesday, January 6th of the year 2026 to initiate and found a non-profit, non-partisan and non-denominational community-based organization which shall be known as **“Renewed Hope for Children and Teens”**, **“REHOCT in acronym.”**

The organization created is for the benefit of the grieving and vulnerable children and teens in order to find sustainable solutions to their problems so that they can heal, learn, and grow, transforming their sorrow into strength and their vulnerability into resilience. Through our collective efforts, we seek to renew their hope and guide them toward a life of purpose and fulfillment of their God-given potential. Together, we will cultivate a supportive network that encourages personal growth and meaningful connections.

II. DATE OF REGISTRATION AND CERTIFICATION OF THE ORGANIZATION:

After fulfilling all the registration requirements and due diligence by the local Government Authorities, the organization was dully registered on January 8th, 2026 by the Magu District Council Authority and awarded the registration certificate Number **MDC/CBO/4850**.

The organization adhere to Magu District Council Policy on Community-Based Organizations operating in Magu District, Mwanza region in the United Republic of Tanzania.

III. AREA OF OPERATION OF THE ORGANIZATION:

The Organization shall operate legally in the all-geographical area constituting Magu district (Square Kilometers 2,671 which includes 4 divisions, 25 wards, 82 villages and 508 hamlets) with a population of 421,119 according to Tanzania National Bureau of Statistics 2022 Census. The organization plans in future

to reach other areas of Mwanza region particularly and Tanzania generally as its grows and succeed in the implementation of its activities in the initial legally registered area of operation.

IV. VISION STATEMENT OF THE ORGANIZATION:

To see grieving and underprivileged rural children and teens are healed from grief and loss, supported, and empowered to live with hope, dignity, and purpose.

V. MISSION STATEMENT OF THE ORGANIZATION:

Empowering grieving and underprivileged rural children and teens through education access support, holistic care, and opportunities to realize and fulfill their God-given potential and break the cycle of poverty.

VI. OBJECTIVES OF THE ORGANIZATION:

The organization shall orient its activities benefiting primarily grieving and underprivileged rural children and teens to learn, grow, heal and achieve their dreams under the following objectives:

1. Support the access to education for grieving and underprivileged rural children and teens to help them achieve their God-given potential and break the cycle of poverty;
2. Provide healthcare, educational materials, shelter, and food support to underprivileged rural children and teens in critical need;
3. Offer holistic care services to support grieving and underprivileged rural children and teens in their transition to adulthood, coping and healing from grief and loss;
4. Empower families and communities to fight abuse, violence and discrimination against grieving and underprivileged rural children and teens.

VII. PROGRAMS OF THE ORGANIZATION:

Our organization is committed to supporting grieving and underprivileged rural children and teens through holistic, teen and child-centered programs that promote healing, resilience, and long-term well-being. We address emotional, psychosocial, spiritual, educational, and economic needs to help these innocents grieving and deprived rural children and teens overcome loss, trauma, and poverty and realize their full potential.

1. Grief Care & Emotional Healing:

We provide safe and nurturing spaces where grieving children and teens can express their emotions, share their stories, and begin the healing process. Through age-appropriate counseling, peer support, creative activities, and guided conversations, participants learn healthy coping mechanisms for grief and trauma. Memory Books for Children, implemented through Memory Book Clubs, form a core component of this program, helping children process loss and preserve meaningful memories.

2. Education Access and Basic Needs Support:

This program supports grieving and underprivileged rural children and teens who have lost one or both parents or caregivers and those facing extreme poverty by removing barriers to education and basic needs access. We provide school fees, uniforms, supplies, clothing, food, shelter, and healthcare support to create a stable and conducive learning environment. The program enables participants to perform well academically, reduce the long-term effects of grief and poverty, and pursue a brighter, hope-filled future aligned with their God-given potential.

3. Hope, Purpose & Values Formation:

In collaboration with local church leaders, faith-based organizations, and religion teachers in schools, we nurture spiritual growth and moral values in a respectful and supportive manner. Children and teens are guided to discover hope, purpose, and inner strength through faith-based teaching, prayer, and values formation helping them develop core values such as integrity, respect, responsibility, compassion, honesty, forgiveness, and self-discipline, which guide them in making healthy life choices. Memory Book Clubs activities are also integrated into this program to support emotional and spiritual reflection as they provide a creative outlet for expressing emotions, preserving memories, and fostering reflection, while mentorship from caring adults offers consistent support and encouragement.

4. Life Skills & Empowerment:

We equip out-of-school grieving and underprivileged rural children and teens with vocational training and essential life skills that prepare them for independence and responsible adulthood. Beneficiaries gain practical skills for income generation, leadership development, decision-making, and personal growth. This program empowers participants to break the cycle of poverty, become self-reliant, and positively transform their social and economic circumstances.

5. Mentorship & Psychosocial Support:

This program offers continuous psychosocial support, guidance, and counseling to grieving and underprivileged rural children and teens. Through structured activities and one-on-one or group mentorship, participants are connected with trained, caring mentors who provide encouragement, positive role modeling, and emotional support. The program helps young people build self-esteem, trust, emotional stability, and a sense of belonging while navigating daily challenges and planning for their future.

6. Family & Community Engagement:

We actively engage families, caregivers, schools, churches, and community leaders to strengthen support systems around children and teens. By working collaboratively with the community, we ensure a protective environment that reinforces positive outcomes and sustains long-term impact beyond program participation.

VIII. INTERVENTIONS STRATEGIES:

The organization shall use the intervention strategies outlined here down in order to fulfill its mission, vision and objectives in its operations:

1. To work directly with children and teens, families, communities, schools, churches and any other institution or organization serving children locally for reaching and supporting the grieving and underprivileged rural children and teens to grow in a safe environment, heal their pains, access education and fulfill their God-given potentials;
2. To engage, collaborate and partner locally and internationally with faith and non-faith-based organizations, charities, companies and individuals for the purpose of developing mutual cooperation aiming to support and promote our interventions in helping grieving and vulnerable children and teens in our working area.

IX. CORE VALUES OF THE ORGANIZATION:

The organization shall observe and fulfill the following core values in all its existence and operations:

- 1. Dignity:** We honor the inherent worth of every child, ensuring they are respected, protected, and valued.
- 2. Compassion:** We respond to grief, poverty, and vulnerability with empathy, kindness, and understanding.
- 3. Hope:** We believe every child's story can be renewed and that healing and restoration are possible.
- 4. Faith:** We are guided by faith in God the Almighty as the source of love, healing, and purpose.
- 5. Empowerment:** We equip children and teens with emotional, spiritual, education and life skills to build resilient and meaningful futures.
- 6. Integrity:** We serve with transparency, accountability, and excellence in all we do.
